

# Great South Coast Health and Wellbeing Profile

Version 3 - May 2016

This spreadsheet is a collation of published data sets which have been selected as measures to illustrate how the municipalities of the Great South Coast are faring in relation to the health and wellbeing of their community. The data represents:

- the most recent, publicly available data for each measure at January 2015 (Note Source 21 AEDC 2015 and 22 Unemployment rate was updated in April 2016)
- indicators or data sets which are consistently available across the five LGAs.

It should be noted that much of the data presented are 'indicators' (ie not from whole of population surveys) and are subject to the validity constraints identified in the source.
