

GLENELG SHIRE FOOD AND FIBRE FACTS* August 2015

Glenelg Shire's food and fibre industry has a gross output of \$288.10M, directly employs 1462 people and has a value added figure of \$122.63M. This industry is 9% of total Shire output, 7.5% of value added and accounts for 5.1% of people employed in the Shire.

By way of comparison, the value added for food (primary industries and manufacturing) accounts for 11% of the Great South Coast region's economy.

A detailed breakdown of output, value added and employment by industry sub-sector is provided in the following table:
