

# TIMBER TOWNS VICTORIA: STRATEGIC PLAN FOR 2022 – 2025

### MISSION

Timber Towns Victoria (TTV) is the local government voice on timber related matters and their impact on local communities and local government infrastructure.

### **KEY OBJECTIVES**

- To deliver leadership and advocacy for the interests of local government and their communities, particularly road and bridge infrastructure.
- To provide a forum for local government to share information and to address timber related issues
- To be a credible and respected stakeholder on timber issues, representing local government in working with the community, all levels of governments and the timber industry.
- To support and assist councils managing the impact of timber related issues
- To support sustainable communities and local government infrastructure.

### **KEY STRATEGIES**

### **Government Relations:**

- 1. Establish and maintain constructive relationships across all levels of government representatives and relevant agencies.
- 2. Keep abreast of changes to policies and strategies in relation to the forestry and timber sector and make submissions where appropriate.
- 3. Seek representation for TTV to be appointed to any Government review panels / committees where timber is the focus.

## Transport and Infrastructure:

- 1. Seek funding commitments from the Victorian and Commonwealth Governments to maintain and upgrade local roads and bridge infrastructure.
- 2. Facilitate information and advice to members on freight, road science and other transport related knowledge sectors, for sustainable road management and capital works planning
- 3. Work with Department of Transport (DoT) and Regional Development Victoria (RDV) on the need for local data to assist with their budget modelling.
- 4. Review Timber Industry Road Evaluation Study (TIRES) Report 2022 2027
- 5. Keep abreast of new regional infrastructure plans and provide feedback as required.

### Land Use Management and Planning Scheme:

- 1. Monitor timber related statutory obligations and government policies related to forestry on public and private land
- 2. Provide information and advice to members on planning requirements for plantation development and sustainable land use practices
- 3. Promote and encourage councils in the sharing of skills and knowledge on the implementation of the Code of Practice for Forestry.
- 4. Provide timely and well-informed input into the development of government policies related to the forestry industry
- 5. Work with member Councils to assist in the adaptation of planning schemes and land use management that reflects their desired relationship with the forestry industry.
- 6. Assist in the adoption of a Municipal Strategic Statement that identifies the importance of forestry to the local economy.
- 7. Work with government departments and Councils to progress initiatives and resolve issues.

# **TTV Communications:**

- 1. Increase awareness of TTV through print media and social media platforms.
- 2. Ensure the TTV website provides relevant accessible information.
- 3. Maintain an active social media presence.
- 4. Maintain TTV representation on appropriate external committees and groups.
- 5. Consider representation at forestry forums and events.

## TTV Membership and Services:

- 1. Deliver forums and other events for all Victorian councils to increase their knowledge and understanding of freight, transport, infrastructure and the impact of the forestry sector
- 2. Encourage TTV members to remain active participants and provide opportunities for them for relevant and timely information and to engage with state government and industry.
- 3. Encourage non-member councils to join TTV where the forest and wood products industry influences and impacts are significant to local government infrastructure, their community and local economy.
- 4. Develop a satisfaction survey for members
- 5. Assist Member Councils with funding opportunities.
