Australian Kelpie Centre

Vast arrange of free maps and guides, souvenirs, interpretive displays and free WiFi.

Mickle Lookout

Bilston's Tree

A sapling planted in 1200 AD, this River Red Gum is reputed to contain the largest volume of millable timber of the species. A 25-minute drive north of Casterton.

Wilkin Flora and Fauna Reserve

Take a picnic, bird watch or admire the wildflowers in season from August to October. Free bush camping allowed at Mill Swamp.

Red-Tailed Black-Cockatoo

In danger of extinction, the sub-species South Eastern Red-Tailed Black-Cockatoo (Calyptorhynchus banksii graptogyne) is found only in South-West Victoria and South East S.A.

Long Lead Track Camping and Picnic Area

Nature walks, wood BBQ, tables, picnic shelter area, fire pits & pit toilets. Waterbirds. kangaroos, emus and wildflowers. 18km from Casterton just off Penola Road.
