A MESSAGE FROM OUR TEAM LEADER EDUCATION AND CARE

At the start of Term 2 we saw several of our early learning services involved in wreath making, the wreaths were then displayed on Anzac Day, placed on the soldiers crosses that the services have adopted. Educators continue to incorporate Anzac Day into the educational program annually.

Council continues to review and update their suite of Policies and Procedures, families are invited to provide feedback on any Policy under review, a sign will be located in the service foyer with the current Policy under review.

During Term 2, each service will review its Philosophy. A philosophy is a statement to share the values and beliefs that frame their program. A philosophy influences every aspect of the child's day, from the way the environment is set up, to the role that teachers have in guiding children's play. Children, families and staff will be involved in the review to ensure the Philosophy is relevant to the current cohort of service users. We look forward to your contribution to the Philosophy review, as your feedback matters.

Our six kindergarten's have been successful in participating in the first roll out of the Early Years Assessment and Learning Tool (the Tool). The tool has been designed to support early childhood teachers and educators with their observations and assessment of children's learning and development. Teachers and educators then use this information to tailor the kindergarten program to best help your child learn. Teachers and educators are currently undergoing professional development to enable them to use this Tool effectively at their service.

LITTLE FREE PANTRY

Did you know we have a Little FREE Pantry at our Centres/Kindergartens

A Little Free Pantry (LFP) is a community-based initiative that aims to provide basic necessities to those in need.

The concept behind it is simple: give what you can, take what you need.

The pantries are located at Kalbarri Kindergarten & Karreeta Peeneeyt Mara Portland Child & Family Complex and are accessible 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and designed to be accessible and nonjudgmental, without any paperwork or registration required for users.

Families and community members are encouraged to donate non-perishable foods or hygiene items to the pantries.

If you wish to donate, simply purchase non-perishable, unopened items within the best-before/use-bydate and place them directly in the pantry.

- Long-life milk & fruit-juice (200mL & 1L)
- Rice, pasta, pasta sauce
- Non-perishable meat (Eg Jerky, Tinned Chicken/ Tuna/ Sardines/ Spam/ Ham)
- Tinned Fruit and Vegetables
- Breakfast items (Eg Instant Oats Sachets, Kellogs variety packs, breakfast biscuits etc)
- Peanut butter and vegemite (small plastic jars preferred)
- Sachets of Sugar, Tea & Coffee
- Snacks (Eg non-perishable dip and biscuits, salsa, muesli bars, multi-packs of chips/savoury biscuits)
- Biscuits (Eg Saladas, VitaWeet, breakfast biscuits)
- Feminine hygiene products
- Toiletries (Eg toothpaste, toothbrushes, deodorant, sunscreen, combs, soap, cotton buds, body wipes, 2-in-1 shampoo/conditioner)
- First-Aid supplies (eg travel first-aid-kits, bandaids, insect repellant, sanitiser)
- Baby supplies (eg formula, nappies, wipes)









CHANGE OF CLOTHES REMINDER

A reminder to families to please ensure you pack a spare change of clothes in your child's bag when they are attending Long Day Care and Kindergarten. The weather is also starting to cool off and we are beginning to see a change in the weather conditions therefore please send a coat with your child to ensure they stay dry and warm when playing outside.

ILLNESS WITHIN THE CENTRE

When a child develops symptoms of illness while at the service, educators will notify the Nominated Supervisor, or person in day-to-day care of the service, that a child is unwell. The educator will contact the parents/guardians or authorised emergency contact for the child to outline the signs and symptoms observed and request that the child is collected from the service.

Glenelg Shire Council Children's Services is committed to providing a safe and healthy environment while maintaining a duty of care to the children, and users of Glenelg Shire Children's Services.

CHILD SAFETY ADVISE

The advise on children in car restraints from Vic roads is.

Booster seats

Children aged 4 years to less than 7 years must use either:

- a forward-facing child restraint with an inbuilt harness, or
- a booster seat.



Children grow at different rates and there can be big differences in their heights and weights. Therefore, you can choose the type of restraint that is best for your child's size.

Even if your child is 4 years old, they may not be ready to travel in a booster seat. We recommend you keep your child in their forward-facing restraint with an inbuilt harness until they are too big for it and then move to a booster seat.

Front or back seat?

Children aged 4 years old to under 7 years old can only sit in the front seat if all the back seats are taken by other passengers under 7 years old.

If your vehicle does not have a back seat (e.g. a ute) they can travel in the front seat if they are in a child restraint.











NEVER LEAVE CHILDREN IN THE CAR

A friendly reminder to all families to ensure that you never leave a child in a car.

In Victoria, it is against the law to leave a child unattended in a car.

The Never Leave Kids in Cars campaign prompts parents to take their kids with them whenever they get out of the car, just as they do their everyday valuables, to avoid potentially tragic consequences.

Balancing CCS payments at end of financial year

At the end of the financial year, which is 30 June, Services Australia compares your income estimate with your actual income to check you got the right amount of Child Care Subsidy (CCS). This is called balancing. You need to confirm your family's income before Services Australia can balance your payments. There are deadlines.

One year after the financial year ends

You have one year to confirm your income.

If you don't confirm your income within 12 months after the end of a financial year your CCS will stop and you'll have to pay full fees for child care.

If you got CCS for 2021–22 you have until 30 June 2023 to confirm your income.

Two years after the financial year ends

If you still haven't confirmed your income two years after a financial year ends you may have to repay any CCS you received for that financial year.

If you haven't confirmed your income for 2020–21 you must do so by 30 June 2023.

How to confirm income

Confirm your income by:

- lodging your tax return, or
- telling Services Australia that you don't need to lodge, even if you've already told the Australian Taxation Office.

Easy Scone dough pizzas

Base:

- 2 cups self-raising flour
- 1 cup milk (dairy, soy, coconut, etc.)

Toppings:

- Sauce of choice
- Add a little cheese
- Toppings of choice, eg. Ham, chicken, pineapple, herbs mushrooms, red onion, capsicum, spinach. Sundried tomato etc.
- Add extra cheese on top



- 1. Pre-heat oven to 200°c
- 2. Mix together flour and milk to form a soft dough. Roll out to approximately 5mm thick and place onto a lined baking tray.
- 3. Firmly press on the toppings, flattening them down into the dough a little
- 4. Cook in oven at 200°c for 15 minutes
- 5. Allow to cool for 5 minutes before cutting into portions, or pop into the fridge to cool and enjoy cold.














FROM OUR SERVICES

We went out and collected the different types and colours of leaves and then pasted them onto our trees for our families to see.












Heywood Kindergarten

Great work everyone!













