Use of Council Recreation Reserves

Dog Poo Bag Dispensers

In the last few months of last year, Council installed dog poo bag dispensers at majority of the Portland based recreation reserves and the Heywood Recreation Reserve, with bag dispensers already located at Island Park in Casterton, as well as at both Henty Park and Nelson Park in Portland.



Dog poo bag dispensers are now located at the following recreation

reserves:



- <u>Hanlon Park</u> near the Henty Street entrance
- <u>Alexandra Park</u> between the oval and netball courts, and also near the BMX canteen area
- <u>Flinders Park</u> on the Bentinck Street end of the Football/Cricket changeroom pavilion
- <u>Heywood Recreation Reserve</u> on the highway end of the Football changeroom pavilion near the oval
- <u>Friendly Society Reserve</u> on the Glenelg Street end of the changeroom pavilion (pictured)
- <u>Cavalier Park</u> on the northern end of the pavilion

This initiative is to encourage dog owners to pick-up after their dogs when at a Council managed recreation reserve and keep the area tidy and enjoyable for all users.

Prohibited Activities

To ensure that recreation reserve users are safe and infrastructure is not damaged, the following is not permitted at recreation reserves (with some exceptions as noted below):

- Horses on are not permitted on majority of Council's recreation reserves, with the exception of Licenced User Groups at Yarraman Park in Portland, and the Casterton Polocrosse grounds.
- Golf activities are also not permitted at any Council managed recreation reserve at any time.
- Dogs are not permitted at the Yarraman Park Recreation Reserve in Portland.

Grants & Funding Opportunities

Clubs / User Groups often ask us about where they can go for assistance with Grants or what funding opportunities are available.

<u>VicSport</u> often update their website with links to various grant opportunities some helpful links on their website. There are also some <u>quick links on our website</u> for organisations that regularly release different grant opportunities.

Some externally funded grants and fundraising opportunities that may be of particular interest to your club that are currently advertised include:

- <u>Emergency Sporting Equipment Grant program</u> provides assistance to grassroots sport and
 active recreation clubs and organisations to replace or repair essential sporting and first aid
 equipment that has been lost or destroyed as a consequence of fire, flood, significant storms,
 theft or criminal damage applications are being accepted until 31 May 2025
- <u>Regional All Abilities Participation Grants</u> supports grassroots sport and active recreation clubs and community-based not-for-profit organisations, to enable ongoing, sustainable, and meaningful participation for people with disability in regional Victoria - applications close 10 February 2025
- <u>Australian Cricket Infrastructure Fund (ACIF)</u> provides funding of up to \$40,000 for community cricket facility projects, with a focus on growing participation and promoting accessibility and inclusivity - *Applications open on 3 February 2025 and close on 23 March 2025*
- Australian Sports Foundation provides a platform for tax deductible fundraising
