Seasonal Changeover Approaching

With the Winter Season wrapping up this month, seasonal changeover from winter users to summer users is due on 1 October 2024. Council will be undertaking seasonal changeover inspections of relevant Recreation Reserves between 23 September 2024 and 3 October 2024.

These inspections focus on areas such as cleanliness of all reserve facilities, identifying/addressed potential safety hazards, and the overall facility condition.

Notification of upcoming inspections has recently been sent directly to the relevant Recreation Reserves Licenced User Groups, and a summary of any items requiring attention/follow-up from inspections will be provided onto the relevant user group/s.

Council Elections - Caretaker Period

At 12pm on Tuesday 17 September 2024, Glenelg Shire Council will enter the Election Period ahead of the 2024 Local Government Elections.

So what does this mean for our public communication?

Until the end of the Election Period (6pm on Saturday 26 October 2024) Council must avoid actions and decisions which could be seen to be influencing voters, providing an advantage to a Councillor standing for election, or which will have a significant impact on the incoming Council.

As such you won't see the usual number of facebook posts, news bulletins etc by Council during Election Period as you would during the rest of the year, but Council will still update the community with any important information relating to our usual services and activities.

Grants & Funding Opportunities

Clubs / User Groups often ask us about where they can go for assistance with Grants or what funding opportunities are available.

<u>VicSport</u> often update their website with links to various grant opportunities some helpful links on their website. There are also some <u>quick links on our website</u> for organisations that regularly release different grant opportunities.

Some externally funded grants and fundraising opportunities that may be of particular interest to your club that are currently advertised include:

- <u>Emergency Sporting Equipment Grant program</u> provides assistance to grassroots sport and active recreation clubs and organisations to replace or repair essential sporting and first aid equipment that has been lost or destroyed as a consequence of fire, flood, significant storms, theft or criminal damage - applications are being accepted until 31 May 2025
- <u>Significant Sporting Events program</u> helps organisations to deliver significant sporting events in Victoria, with grants available for event assistance with general operational costs associated with hosting events, and event development to develop or expand events or for events with high operational costs *applications close 31 October 2024*
- <u>Country Football Netball program</u> provides funding to Local Government Authorities to help regional football and netball clubs, associations and umpiring organisations upgrade and develop facilities in rural, regional and outer metropolitan locations. Any eligible clubs interested in this funding must submit <u>an expression of interest form</u> via email to <u>recreation@glenelg.vic.gov.au</u> *due to Council's upcoming election period commencing on 17* September, no applications will be submitted for the current round of this program which closes on 30 September 2024.
