### Glenelg Shire Council Recreation Reserves & Facilities Access Policy

At the Council meeting held on Tuesday 25 June 2024, Council endorsed an updated <u>Recreation Reserves and Recreation Facilities Access Policy</u>, which governs access to recreational reserves and facilities that are owned or managed Council.

The policy aims to improve health and wellbeing outcomes for our community by promoting access to recreational reserves and facilities for sports clubs, community groups, organisations and individuals, that foster participation in active recreation.

A key driver of this policy is to also address the principles identified within the <u>Victorian State</u> <u>Governments Fair Access Policy roadmap</u>, and align with requirements under the <u>Gender</u> <u>Equality Act 2020</u>.

### Council Recreation Reserve & Pavilions Casual Bookings Fees & Charges

# Did you know that most of Council's Recreation Reserve pavilions and facilities can be casually booked by other organisations, schools or for private recreation events (subject to availability)?

As part of Council's annual budget process, the 2024-25 Fees and Charges were endorsed at the 25 June 2024 Council meeting. The <u>2024-25 Fees and Charges Schedule</u> (accessible via Councils website) includes the casual hire fees for recreation reserves and facilities on pages 43-51.

Round 1 of the 2024-25 Glenelg Shire Community Grants are <u>OPENING SOON</u>!

Not for profit organisations/groups are invited to submit a grant application under the first round of 2024-25 Glenelg Shire Community Grants for up to \$1,000 without any co-contribution, OR for amounts over \$1,000 and up to \$5,000 a dollar for dollar contribution is required from the community organisation/group.\*

The first round of Community Grants is only open for 2 weeks, from **9am on Wednesday 24 July 2024 and close at 5pm on Wednesday 7 August 2024**.
